What is Alternative Dispute Resolution?

Alternative dispute resolution (ADR) refers to procedures for settling disputes outside of litigation and court adjudication.

ADR includes techniques that provide alternative options such as negotiation, conciliation, mediation and arbitration. These options are available in specialised tribunals.

Is Mediation an option for my situation?

Mediation is a great alternative and is an informal process which includes a neutral third party that supports the parties in arriving at a mutual agreement. A mediator uses an interest-based approach and plays a co-operative role in mediation.

A mediator has no authority to impose a solution, but rather a mediator works directly with the parties to arrive at a solution that is mutually beneficial in the outcome being sought.

In some instances, mediation is mandatory and others are voluntary. A mediator prepares a mediation agreement that is signed by all parties and any agreement met, will be put in writing.

Mediation can be conducted both by video conference and in person.
